- It fixes the annual remuneration at \$12,000 for the mayor and at \$4,000 for each Councillor;
- The current annual remuneration in 2019 is \$8,415 for the mayor and \$2,805 for each Councillor. In addition, and in accordance with the Act, an expense allowance representing 50% of the remuneration thus established shall be paid to each member of Council.

- *The By-law does not provide for automatic indexation or additional remuneration.*
- These amounts will be paid monthly out of the general account of the municipality.

WHEREAS the required formalities have been respected.

- to adopt By-law number 362-2019 relating to the remuneration of elected municipal officers;
